THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

'Pou are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Mk. 1.11)

Today marks the official end of the Christmas Season. Our masses for Monday begin another year of Ordinary Time for the Church.

Did you ever wonder why Jesus was baptized by John? I mean, if you really think about it, shouldn't it have likely been the other way around? That is how we mortal creatures think. The theology of the baptism of the Lord is rich and very deep.

Let's begin by looking into today's readings. Not to many weeks ago, we read about John's disciples going to Jesus and asking if he was indeed the one who was to come. Jesus explains to John's disciples that the prophet Isaiah foretold of him when he said, as we hear in our first reading today, "I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring prisoners out of confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness."



Earlier in this passage, we also hear Isaiah speaking God's words when he says, "Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am well pleased, upon whom I have put my spirit." It has been said many times that Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah, a word that comes from the Greek and Hebrew respectively, meaning "God's anointed one." Anointing is a means by which God chooses his elect and signifies that choice by anointing with oil through a priest or prophet. Anointing with oil being poured over the anointed is significant for the baptism of Jesus as well.

Jesus was not, as far as we know, anointed with oil, but rather, was anointed by the Holy Spirit. It is significant to remember that Jesus, even though he was God, he was also man. That is to say, he was One Divine Person with Two Natures - One Divine Nature and One Human Nature. In contrast, you and I are human persons imbued with a human nature - one person-one nature. As we know, Jesus was very different. As the Son of the Father, he is the second person of the Blessed Trinity. And as we also know, God is a spiritual being. God is immense and miniscule at the same time. He is all-powerful and meek and humble at the same time and so on and so on...

In his human *nature* it was necessary for him to be baptized by John so that we too might know the benefits of repentance and reconciliation with the Father. Our Father in heaven is all merciful and desires only that we love him in return for his love for us. So he sent his Son to step into time and space and take on human flesh. He was to be our sacrificial lamb much like the lamb that God instructed Moses to tell the Hebrews to choose and slaughter for that first (and all subsequent) Passover(s). God would continually lead his people into covenant with himself and send prophets to tell us how he would do that and enlighten us along the way.



When Jesus went down into the river water, it was as if he was telling us of his dying to this life and when he rose up again, it was symbolic of his promised new life and resurrection. It has also been said that when he came up out of the river waters, it was then that he took on our sins and would carry them with him to the end, when they could be nailed to the cross.

You see, Jesus did not need John's baptism for his salvation. But in accepting baptism from John he showed how we can become humble, and through our contrition be reconciled to the Father.

When the Sacred Son of God stepped into the Jordan to be baptized, he sanctified all of the world's waters so that they may be blessed and used throughout time for the people of God to first, be baptized, and second to recall our baptism by blessing ourselves each time we dip our fingers into the holy water font.

The Baptism of the Lord is a great time for us to recall our own baptism, and as we close out this latest Christmas Season to recall the great gift of faith we have received through Christ our Lord. It has been said that Jesus is the "Greatest Gift", and as we close out this gift-giving season we can reflect once again about the significance of gifts—giving and receiving—and try to keep it in context of the mysterious gifts that continually surprise and amaze us, as we ponder the goodness of our God.

Next Sunday, January 18th will be the OUTREACH for Youth Ministry. It will be a Euchre Tournament/Other Games of Fun.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

Today, we resume the RCIA process with our discussion topic on Sacramental Reconciliation. We will review old conceptions about confession; talk a little about the history of the sacrament; learn the process of the Rite of Reconciliation through some role playing.

Next week, we will move on to Baptism and Confirmation. These two sacraments, along with First Holy Communion are the Sacraments of Initiation into the Christian Church. We will be preparing our candidates to better understand the basic relationship between these three sacraments; gain an appreciation of the symbols involved in the sacraments; continue preparation for these specific rites, as may be necessary according to each one's need; and finally, we will discuss the history of the separation of the Initiation Rite into three separate sacraments.

Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD)

If you would like your son or daughter to learn to be an altar server, please let us know in the parish office as we are beginning to put together a plan in which we will be able to teach the children the proper form and practice of serving at the altar during mass. You can also let Mr. Corrigan know on Wednesday evenings when you bring your children to CCD.

Even though we missed class this past week due to the severe cold weather, we will maintain the schedule and have Group B in attendance this week (January 14th). This is also a reminder that everything for Confirmation and First Holy Communion is due to be turned in at the parish office. Everything except the service hours and the heights of those who will need to purchase a red gown is due. This also means the banners for the children who will receive their First Holy Communion this year. Please be sure the banner includes the child's first and last names. If you're not sure if something is due, please turn it in anyway so we can get all of the information up to date.

Adult Faith Formation

Fr. Bo will soon begin presenting on a program called "Oremus." This is a study on, and a guide to Catholic prayer. This will be a perfect opportunity to deepen your relationship with Jesus through a Lenten preparation that is also sure to make our Easter celebration much more powerful! This is usually presented as an 8-part series, but we are hoping to be able to consolidate a couple of the lessons so that we are only meeting maybe 6 times. Keep an eye on this area for further information to come very soon.




