



In the event of inclement weather this weekend-Saturday or Sunday, Mass will still be celebrated, however, it will be via Zoom from Father's Chapel in the rectory. Distribution of the Eucharist will still take place at 6 p.m. on Saturday; for Sunday, if the weather is inclement and Mass needs to move indoors, Father will still distribute Communion at 9 a.m. and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will follow with an approximate start time of 9:20 a.m.

To Access Mass via Zoom:

Please Read Carefully:

There are a few instructions you will need to follow.

- 1. Once you have logged into the meeting, please be sure to mute your audio input (your mic). If everyone responds online it sounds horrible. There will be one household designated as "the people" who will be heard by everyone, especially me so that I know when to continue.
- 2. If you want to be a reader, just email me and let me know and I can schedule that to make it happen. You can go to the USCCB website and find the daily readings if you do not have a missalette and you want to follow along.
- 3. Remember to respond at home as you normally would, just be sure you are muted. What you will see most of the time is the Chapel inside the Rectory here at Holy Cross, where I am saying Mass.

We will use the same ID and Password, and the same Link, for each Mass. You can either click on the Link, or go to Zoom and enter the ID and Password. They are the same for every scheduled Mass (it will say meeting on Zoom). The first time you go to Zoom you will have to enter a new id and password for yourself. But it is free and you can attend any meeting you want. Or you can download the app for your smartphone or iPad/tablet.

Our Devotion for the Month of June is the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most popular Catholic devotions. Although it was beloved in previous centuries, Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1673, showing her a vision of the now-famous image of His Sacred Heart, surrounded by



flames. He said to her: "My Heart is so full of love for men that It can no longer contain the flames of Its burning love. I must discover to men the treasures of My Heart and save them from perdition." She was given the special mission to spread devotion to His Sacred Heart throughout the Church. Jesus gave St. Margaret Mary many promises associated with this devotion, and requested that a feast day in honor of His Sacred Heart be instituted on the Friday after the Octave of Corpus Christi. In 1856, the Feast of the Sacred Heart was spread to the Universal Church, and in 1899 Pope Leo XIII solemnly consecrated all mankind to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, calling it "the great act" of his pontificate.

The Adoration is scheduled from 2:00—3:00 p.m. every Sunday.



The Scandal of the Eucharist

Have you ever seen someone express shock when they learn that the Church believes that the "communion bread" is not bread at all, but has truly become the Body of Christ?

This shock hearkens back to the response to Jesus' original prophecy of the Eucharist. John 6 recounts that after Jesus repeatedly proclaimed that his disciples would eat his flesh and drink his blood, many no longer followed him. They found his promise too difficult to accept; and Jesus did not force them to accept it, but allowed them to leave. He was interested in conversion, not compliance.

He even asked those who remained if they, too, wanted to leave, and Peter responded, "Master, to whom would we go? We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

Belief in the Eucharist is a gift. It is the fruit of a relationship of faith and trust in Jesus. Eucharistic faith also reveals that the unimagined love expressed on the cross is even further magnified by Jesus' desire to be so closely and carnally united to us in the Eucharist. The love that would not be contained by death is a love that also refuses to be contained by time and space. It is a love that seeks to be present in all times and places where there are believing disciples. Present, not just spiritually, but through the Real Presence of the Word made flesh, the very Body of Christ.

Come, let us adore him. Amen.

Thirteenth Sunday in Brdinary Time

DIVINE REVELATION



"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me..."

Matthew 10::37

HE PRAYER KNOWN AS the Shema in Hebrew is perhaps the premier prayer of the lewish people. Prayed several times every day, it is part of Jesus' teaching on what are the two greatest commandments: "Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength..." (see Mark 12:29-30).

In today's Gospel readings, we have a clear example of Jesus using implicit language to indicate that he is coequal with God the Father. His reference to Shema as the greatest command is meant to help his apostles recall that it is only God who demands the kind of love and devotion. He is not saying outright, "I Am God!" Rather, the message is implied.

There is a passage that is omitted from today's reading that lies directly between last week's Gospel and today's. It is the passage that indicates Jesus is a cause for division, and reads as follows:

"Do not think that I have come to bring peace upon the earth. I have come to bring not peace, but the sword. For I have come to set a man 'against his father, a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; and one's enemies will be those of his household."'

With the state of today's world, it would have been nice to place a bit of focus on this passage. I only bring the passage to light for context. It is right before today's words of the Gospel are spoken that Jesus is telling the twelve about the coming division in the world.

And so it is that after that omitted passage that Jesus is talking about the conditions necessary to be his disciple and walk after him in the way he himself walks. To love father or mother, son or daughter more than Jesus is to be disqualified from following him.

To be clear, however, he is not saying that we must not love our father, mother, son, or daughter—only that we cannot love them more than we love him. And when lesus talks about love, he is talking about an active love, not some emotional or sentimental construct. The love of Jesus is a love all the way to the Crucifix!

To truly be a disciple of Christ is to live a rightlyordered life, a life that has love of God at its center, and then love of neighbor follows that. Every action we take is supposed to be deliberate, considering whether the action is according to the will of God. Every action we take is supposed to be done for love of God. It is out of our love for God that we are called to act for the good of "the other." That's the economy of love that Jesus teaches...God loves us first, we return God's love to him by the way we love our fellow man.

I imagine at some point in life almost any child, thinking selfish and childly thoughts, and not getting his way, could express something along the lines of "I wish I was never even born! I didn't ask to come into this world!!" And while it's true that no one asked to come into the world, each and every one of us is here because of a willful desire.

God desired to share His Divine Love with each and every one of us for all eternity—if only we will honor and obey Him and His commandments. It's why that from the time we were wee little ones that we were taught that we should try to see the face of Jesus in every person we see and meet. If we can achieve that, then the next step of loving our neighbors for the sake of the love of God will be easy. Seeing the face of Jesus in every person we encounter has turned out to be a very tall order though, hasn't it?

The news today is full of division. There is division in the world, and division in the family. If we could but fix the family—that is, the domestic church—then many of society's ills will begin to recede.

It is our job as Catholic Christians to willfully and decisively work to bring about that love of God first in the world, so that we can then also do the work of loving our neighbors. Understanding the teachings of Christ isn't hard, but living out our call to discipleship is certainly a challenge!



» How to get an indulgence? «
These Q & A ITEMS ARE ADDRESSING QUESTIONS
USING THE BALTIMORE CATECHISM:

† How does the Church by means of indulgences remit the temporal punishment due to sin?

The Church, by means of indulgences remits the temporal punishment due to sin by applying to us from her spiritual treasury part of the infinite satisfaction of Jesus Christ and of the superabundant satisfaction of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the saints.

For there is one God, and one Mediator between God and men, himself man, Christ Jesus, who gave himself a ransom for all, bearing witness in his own time. (1 Timothy 2:5-6)

† What is the superabundant satisfaction of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the saints?

The superabundant satisfaction of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the saints is that which they gained during their lifetime but did not need, and which the Church applies to their fellow members of the communion of saints.

† What must we do to gain an indulgence for ourselves? To gain an indulgence for ourselves we must be in the state of grace, have at least a general intention of gaining the indulgence, and perform the works required by the Church.

† Can we gain indulgences for others?

We cannot gain indulgences for other living persons, but we can gain them for the souls in purgatory, since the Church makes most indulgences applicable to them.



THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



With the upheaval in routine that the Novel Coronavirus has caused, it has necessitated a change in how we approach the religious education of the children of our parish.

It is most unlikely that we will be using the school for our Wednesday night classes, and will most likely be changing our program to one that is focused on the family and utilizes remote, or an "eLearning" style of catechesis. All parish families will need to have access to the internet and a computer or tablet to participate in each lesson.

This will also necessarily bring about great change, but should also allow for much more flexibility as the lion's share of the catechesis will take place in the home rather than in the school classroom.

As this is a major change and will be a bigger expense up front, it will be critically important for families to register their children as soon as possible. There is a registration form included with this bulletin—please complete the form and turn it in to the parish office as soon as possible. It is vitally important that we know the number of families and students before the school year begins.

A final decision on the program we will use has not yet been made. We will be communicating more information as we continue to determine which program curriculum we will be using and what it will mean for each family. We ask for your prayers and patience as we work through this difficult process. I do anticipate that for this first year, we will continue using the same sacramental preparation curricula for First Reconciliation/Eucharist and Confirmation. It will just be of a more remote style of disseminating the lessons.

There will be more information to come in that regard as well.

OPEN WIDE THE DOORS ~ LET US ONCE AGAIN PRAY AS A COMMUNITY

If you are a registered member on Flocknote, you may have seen the request for volunteers to help get the parish closer to reopening so that we can once again celebrate the Mass inside our church building.

There is still a great need for many volunteers—and the more people on board, the less strain there will be on any one individual.

Father would also like to remind everyone that the faithful are still dispensed from their Sunday obligation to attend Mass. So if one is still a bit leery of returning to public spaces, you needn't worry about falling into mortal sin because of missing Sunday Mass. Father is also still intending to live-feed the Mass via the Zoom app, as he has been doing since the Mass has been made available to the faithful through that, and other means.

There are still some things that should be made known up front so potential volunteers can know more about what they will be signing up for. For example, a person *should* be under 60 years of age (generally speaking) and in good health.

We already have "Captains" identified who are willing to head up the important work of greeting, ushering, and cleaning. These are the main areas for which we are hoping to get lots more volunteers. We also will accept the help of high school age teens, with the permission of their parents or guardians. All precautions are being taken to ensure the health and safety of all parish staff and

volunteers. We will have plenty of hand sanitizer, and cleaning supplies to keep our church in safe and healthy state for people to worship and pray without the worry of contracting the coronavirus.



Mass continues to be celebrated in the parish parking lot for the time being. There is an allowance being made now for people who would like to sit outside of their cars; you may bring a lawn chair and sit off to the side in the grassy area, as long as social distancing is maintained.

In the event of inclement weather, Father will go back to celebrating the Mass in the rectory chapel and live stream via Zoom, as he began doing when the shelter-in-place order first came about. It is Father's intent to live stream all Masses whether in the parking lot or in the rectory chapel, so that those who cannot attend in person may still participate using their streaming device.

We are still dispensed from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass, so if a person is not able, there is no penalty of mortal sin attached.

It is also important to note that Father is planning to continue distribution of the Eucharist at 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mon—Sat, and 9 a.m., noon, and 3:15 p.m. on Sundays.

ADDITIONAL NOTE ABOUT REOPENING THE CHURCH

To add to the information regarding reopening the church placed elsewhere in the bulletin, it is intended that we have a the pieces in place to reopen on Sunday, July 5th. It is also hoped that Father will soon be able to add another Mass on the weekend to accommodate parishioners being inside, while still on a limited number basis. This would allow for people who might want to get into church for Mass, but cannot because of seating limitations to have another time option to attend Mass.

A Light Unto My Dath

Some biblical commentators and theologians—especially in the past hundred years or so-have argued that the divinity of Jesus is clearly presented only in the Gospel of John and that the synoptic Gospels present a purely human Christ, a teacher and miracle worker perhaps, but not the Son of God. Nothing could be further from the truth. Saint John indeed presents the divinity of the Lord in relatively straightforward language—The Word became flesh; I and the Father are one; He who sees me sees the Father, etc.—but the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke are no less emphatic regarding Jesus' divine nature, though they employ a different symbol system and mode of expression than John.

Matthew 10:37 is a striking example: Jesus said to his apostles, "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." If a merely human figure said this, we would legitimately laugh him to scorn. To their great credit, neither the Buddha nor Muhammad nor Confucius ever said any such thing. But Jesus effectively declares, "you must love me more than you love even those you treasure most in the entire world." And mind you, he doesn't say, "you must love my teaching or you must love the God I proclaim more than these"; he says, "you must love me more than all of them."

The only one who could legitimately make such a demand is the living God, the good that transcends anything in creation. Though he is stating his case a little more obliquely and indirectly than John, Saint Matthew is teaching here, just as clearly, that lesus is divine.


